Compliance with:		
Health & Safety at Work Act and associated legislation. The Management of Health And Safety at Work Regulations. Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations (PUWER). Construction Design and management Regulations 2007. The Manual Handling Operations Regulations. Personal Protective Equipment Regulations.		
Planning:		
All operatives are to be made aware the general public are not versed in the operation of a construction site and should be conscious of allowing the general public to pass at all times. Where tools and or materials are being carried whole getting to work, two operatives shall be present at all times, one of which shall walk in front to ensure a clear walkway without hindrance to third parties.		
Physical:		
An assessment of PPE requirements will be carried out; this will include eye, head and foot. All operatives shall be issued with the following PPE Hard Hat, Steel Cap Toe Boots, Coveralls and Hi-Vis Vests, and it must be worn at all times to identify them to the construction site.		
Managerial/Supervisory:		
Supervisors/Managers must ensure initial Safe Systems of Work are in place before work begins, and that areas are left safe at the end of each work period. Regular liaison will take place with any third parties to co-ordinate work and control the risks to them.		
Training:		
All operatives will be conversant with site procedures. Toolbox talks to be carried out on a regular basis, but not less than weekly. Training will include any findings of COSHH assessments and should be conveyed to all operatives as to potential hazardous materials in use.
